# Moree district is ute heaven

YOU need only to look down the main street or any local shire road to work out that the Moree district is ute heaven.

And proud Moree ute owners will have the chance to show off their beauties at this year's U Beaut Ute Competition at the 125th annual Moree Show.

Stewardess Camille Lobsey said Moree was full of ute enthusiasts and the competition was a great opportunity for people to show off their utes.

This year's competition features a number of categories, including Best Presented Holden Ute, Best Street Ute, Best Presented Ford Ute, Best Note, Best 4WD Ute, Most Feral Ute, Best BNS Ute, Best Chick's Ute (registration papers must be shown).

And of course there will be the highly coveted Champion Ute of the Show.

Miss Lobsey said entry to the event was \$10 for the first category and \$5 per category thereafter and categories could be changed at any time with the stewardess' discretion.

This year's U Beaut Ute Competition will be held at the showgrounds on Sunday, April 26, with entries accepted between 12pm and 3pm.

"It's a great event and I would encourage anyone interested in bringing their ute along to go for it," Miss Lobsey said.

She said another great feature of this year's Moree Show was the Ute Barrel Race.

The Ute Barrel Race consists of utes individually racing in clover leaf patterns around barrels with the fastest time winning.

Entry to this competition is \$10.

"No unregistered vehicles are able to enter either of the events and no front wheel drive utes or 4WD ute in 4WD are allowed in the barrel race," she said.
